





9th Grade Athletic Eligibility

All athletes must have:

- 1. 2.0 grade point average (C) during the last semester of 8th grade
- 2. Medical clearance form on file www.goalbanyathletics.org
- 3. All student-athletes must register and be cleared through www.familyid.com prior to participation.

Note: Athlete CANNOT step on the field until cleared by the athletic office

Support Services

- Teachers first point of contact for concerns in a specific class
- School Counselors for personal, medical, or academic needs
- Mental Health Counselors for ongoing support
- Assistant Principals: discipline, attendance, student activities

Academic Support

- Tutoring: Math/Spanish hour
- Teacher contact

Communication

- Parent Square for daily and special updates, counseling newsletter, etc

- English: 4 years
- Math: 2 years
- Physical Ed.: 2 years
- Science: 2 years
 - 1 year life
 - 1 year physical
- Social Studies: 3.5 years
 - Ethnic Studies (1 semester 9th)
 - World History (10th)
 - U.S. History (11th)
 - US Gov/Econ (12th)
- Fine Arts: 1 year
- Applied Arts: 1 year

Plus electives* to total 220 credits

1 year = 2 semesters = 10 credits

*Electives include all classes beyond subject area requirement (e.g. 3rd year of math)

Grading

- Quarter grades are like progress reports - and gradebooks do not reset each quarter
- Semester system: only semester grades appear on transcripts
- Grade reports are accessed through Aeries (separate from ongoing Gradebooks)

9th Grade Program

Required 9th Grade Classes

- 1. English 1 or ELD
- 2. Math 1 or Accelerated 1/2 8th grade AMS teacher recommendation *or* assessment for students new to AUSD
- 3. Physical Education (PE 1)
- 4. Identity, Health and Society + Ethnic Studies 1 semester each; may start with either class in fall and will look like 2 classes in course requests

Students in our Special Education Program will work directly with case managers to create a schedule that accurately reflects the Individualized Education Plan (IEP). English Learners/ELD will be placed by teacher recommendation.

Typical 9th Grade Schedule

- 1st Period English
- 2nd Period Math (8th grade teacher rec)
- 3rd Period Physical Education
- 4th Period Identity Health & Society/Ethnic Studies
- 5th Period Biology / Elective*
- 6th Period World Lang / Elective*
- 7th Period Elective* (*Optional*)
 *(Fine Arts, Applied Arts, General Elective)



Course Selection


Steps for Selecting Courses:

- Review course catalog, select classes you are interested in
- Consider teacher recommendations from 8th grade (math, world language, ELD)
- Consider preference for 6 vs 7 class schedule (reminder: you can graduate with plenty of credits taking 6 classes each year!)

Course Selection


- Students will use Aeries to choose classes.
 Course requests can only be made through the student portal
- All courses are year-long except Engineering & Design
- Alternate/2nd choices are required for all electives
- Schedule changes for compelling reasons may only be made during the first week of school
- Please refer to the course lists and instructions posted on the AHS website
- Course selections are due Monday, March 20

- Log into your student Aeries account
- Switch to your Pre-Enrolled Record in Aeries: hover over the student's name and click on the Pre-Enrolled record. It will say [Pre-Enrolled] Grd 9 next to your name






Go to Classes > Course Requests Entry






- Set Subject Area to Show All Courses

- Find classes alphabetically by name






- Available classes will show on the right; selected courses will move to the left column
- Be sure to select alternates for all elective courses






Course Selection Instructions Alternate Course Requests

In addition to English/ELD, P.E., Identity Health and Society, and Math, each student must select a minimum of two courses for a six period day. A seventh period is optional. It is extremely important to list alternates for each elective. If alternates are not listed and your first choice cannot be accommodated, your counselor will choose your course for you. Please make your selections carefully. With few exceptions, changes will NOT be possible.

Courses marked with (*) require teacher recommendations. Semester-long courses with (**) can only be chosen as a 7th course option.

Math, World Language, and English Language Development (ELD) classes are determined by teacher recommendation. The AHS counselors will work with the teachers in these departments to place students in the appropriate level course. No signatures are needed on the course request form in these subjects. For students in our Special Education Program, you will work directly with your Case Manager to create a schedule that accurately reflects your Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

Some advanced level Fine Arts courses are open to 9th graders only after auditions. You may sign up for one of these

courses, but be sure to list at least one alternate choice that does not require an audition.
