

- 1 year = 10 credits
- See course lists and catalog for requirements and options in each subject area
- Electives includes any class taken in each subject area after requirement is met
- For 4-year college eligibility, add 1 year of math and 2 years of language



## **Designing your Schedule**

- Find a good balance between classes & activities
- 6 classes is mandatory. 7 is <u>optional!</u>
- Sleep, mental health, family, friends, & activities are just as important as the schedule you choose.
   Choose wisely.

## Guidelines for choosing classes

- Placement for Math, World Language, and ELD is by teacher recommendation.
- Students with IEPs will work with their case managers so schedules reflect their plan.
- Talk with parents/guardians and teachers about your choices.
- If you're planning to take 6 classes, you may select an unscheduled 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> period.
- List alternate classes for all electives! Low demand, full classes or schedule conflicts mean you may not get first choice



## Guidelines for choosing classes

- Refer to Course List. Choose one course per discipline: English, Social Studies, Math, Science, plus electives (language, fine or applied arts, social studies and general electives).
- Course Catalog with course descriptions and guidance is also posted on website
- Some courses may be pre-scheduled (e.g. social studies grade-level requirements). DO NOT delete pre-scheduled courses.



## 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program

#### Required classes

- English 1 or ELD\*
- Identity, Health and Society + Ethnic Studies (1 semester each - may start with either class in fall and will look like 2 classes in Aeries course requests entry)
- Physical Education
- Math (1 or Accelerated 1/2)\*

\*by teacher recommendation

Students in our Special Education program will work with their case manager to create a schedule that accurately reflects their Individualized Education Plan (IEP)

## 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program


#### Typical 9<sup>th</sup> grade schedule

- 1st period English
- 2<sup>nd</sup> period Math (8<sup>th</sup> grade teacher rec)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> period Physical Education
- 4<sup>th</sup> period Identity, Health and Society
- 5<sup>th</sup> period Biology or Elective
- 6<sup>th</sup> period World Language or Art
- 7<sup>th</sup> period OPTIONAL Elective
- + Advisory 40 min 2x/week


- Log into your Student Aeries account

## Course Selection Instructions: all current students




#### **Course Selection Instructions**

## Course Selection Instructions Alternate Course Requests




Click "Manage" to associate primary and alternate choices
